This incident happened in 1965.

It was 4.00 am and both Guruji and Mukund mama (Guruji's elder brother) were up and dressed and ready to leave their house at Kanchipuram to take the bus to Chennai.

"Where is the cash we brought yesterday?" Mukund mama asked Guruji.

"It is not with Me. When we reached home last night it was a little late. I did not want to keep the cash with Me as it could be unsafe. I asked Nalina and she said she would keep it safely locked in a steel box. So I gave it to her. But after locking the box, she has taken the key and she has gone to sleep in her room." Guruji replied.

"How much cash was it?"

"Rs. 3000."

"That is quite a lot."

"That is why I wanted her to keep it safe."

Mukund mama was at that time working in Kanchipuram and Guruji in Acharapakkam (in Kanchipuram District) (Villipuram-Egmore electrification project of the railways). Guruji used to often stay in Kanchipuram and travel to Chennai. Nalina, the sister of Guruji (since deceased) was staying with them at Kanchipuram. She was the Head Mistress of a school in Kanchipuram.

The two brothers had reached Kanchipuram from Chennai the previous day evening after consulting an astrologer at Chennai for alliances for one of their sisters. They had carried cash of Rs.3000 which was to be brought back to Chennai the next day.

"You should not have done this. Why did you give the cash to her? She will not get up before 4.30 am and we cannot go to her room and wake her up" Mukund mama chided Guruji.

It was not unusual for Mukund mama who was an illustration of meticulous planning and discipline, to get irritated with Guruji.

"The bus leaves at 4.30 am and it is now already 4. We need to take the cash with us. It is high time we started from the house. But now we will have no choice but to cancel the visit to Chennai" Mukund mama said in a tone of frustration.

"Where is the box?" Mukund mama asked.

Guruji pointed to a rather small-sized steel trunk opposite to them. The box was securely locked. Mukund mama kept looking at his wristwatch, disappointment writ large on his face.

But what happened next would have made him pinch himself to see if he was dreaming.

"Mukunda, let us start. We will take the cash and leave. Get up." Guruji's response was bewildering.

Mukund mama watched, first with curiosity and then with disbelief. Guruji went over to the box. Putting His right hand ih His pocket, He took out a hand kerchief. He placed the handkerchief over the box.

Breathing heavily, He concentrated on the box. Then turning to Mukund mama He lifted His hand showing the kerchief. The kerchief was full of currency notes.

"Here I brought the cash out. Count it."

An incredulous Mukund mama took the notes and counted. It was Rs. 3000.

"The box is now empty" Guruji explained.

Mukund mama examined the box to see if it was truly locked and whether the lock had been broken open.

"No, no" Guruji assured him. "The box is as it is. I merely materialized the notes from inside the box into my hands."

Mukund mama packed the notes into a cloth bag and the duo left fot Chennai.

In those days Mukund mama had not yet understood the 'spiritual giant' that Guruji was. A particular alliance looked like getting frozen for their sister. When they were at Kanchipuram, Guruji asked Mukund mama to chant for a period of forty days, "OM Sri Peethe Sura Poojithe.." which we all chant in sequence before the Guru shlokam. Mukund mama chanted that. The alliance got fixed.

Materialising, ie: the power to make an article appear from nowhere or disappear, is a siddhi that Guruji had and there are several occasions when He has done that. What Guruji used to say is that you cannot create an article, at most you can transfer it from one location to another. For example, if Guruji had to get hold of these currency notes totaling to Rs. 3000, He cannot generate these notes de novo and bring new currency notes into existence. He can at best move the notes from one place to another so that to an on-looker the notes may suddenly appear or disappear.

From the Doctor's Desk



Report on the Eye Camp conducted on 31st January 2015, at our *DMS* Centre, Alamadhi

An eye camp was conducted at our centre on 31.1.15, by Gurupriya Vision Research Foundation and Radhatri Netralaya. An optometrician and optician deputed by them conducted the relevant tests.

One hundred and twenty two patients (Male 35 and Female 87) attended the camp.

Twenty six patients had cataract and were advised surgery with intraocular lens replacement. These patients will undergo blood tests and ECG. If found fit for surgery, free cataract surgery will be conducted on the affected eyes. Eleven patients had refractory errors (both near and distant vision). Spectacles were ordered for them and these will be given to them when ready. Reading glasses were given to twelve patients. These were patients who had only near vision difficulty. Five patients had retinal problem and one child had Squint which requires correction.

A 'plus 1' student (Ms. Ashwini), who had progressive loss of vision from the age of 9, was taken by our nurse to their hospital in T.Nagar, for further evaluation. She was found to have retinal detachment in the left eye of long standing duration, for which unfortunately no treatment can be done now. The right eye too has retinal detachment, for which follow up every year will be required. Further, she has squint in the same eye, for which surgery has to be done, after she becomes 20 years old.

Annadhaanam was done for all the patients at the conclusion of the camp.
